

SEAN JENSEN Shares Super Bowl Content for Young Athletes Across Multiple Platforms

Minneapolis, Minn. ? Super Bowl LV is set, with the Kansas City Chiefs hoping to defend its crown and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers aiming to complete its underdog journey.

After graduating from Northwestern University, Sean K Jensen spent 15 years covering the NFL for major newspapers and websites, and making appearances on numerous ESPN and NFL Network platforms, as well as CNN and ABC's Good Morning America. Now, though, he works with children in multiple capacities, and brings his storytelling and analyzing skills to uniquely break down the big game for oldest and youngest fans.

"As a sportswriter, I had the great fortune to deal with everyone who power our nation's most popular sport, from the players and coaches, to agents and owners, and everyone else in between," he says. "I think it's important to provide a perspective so the youngest fans can truly understand what it takes to make it to the Super Bowl, and the lessons they can learn."

On his website, Sean spotlights the "5 Most Overlooked Players in Super Bowl LV," sharing the remarkable underdogs who are playing in football's biggest game. In his podcast *Winning Is Not Everything*, Sean will break down the 4 Keys to a Championship Team, highlighting the importance of having "coachable" players. In his weekly message to Minnesota Youth Athletic Services, Sean focuses on one of the most "coachable" athletes to emerge from the state, Tyler Johnson, who starred at North Community High School in Minneapolis and the University of Minnesota before being drafted by the Bucs last offseason. On NBC Sports' *Sports Engine*, Sean reinforces "How to Relish a Big Sports Moment." And on Friday, two days before Super Bowl LV, Sean is hosting a free webinar of his video series *Model Student Athlete*, including a full viewing of his training session on "Being Coachable." Viewers will learn the 15th-century origin of the word "coach," the different levels of "coach-ability," and hear and see insights on being coachable from a range of sporting legends such as Tom Brady, Michael Jordan, Pete Sampras and legendary University of Tennessee women's

basketball coach Pat Summitt.

"The Super Bowl is consistently one of the most-watched programs on television each year," Sean says, "and I think young athletes deserve content that will get them excited about the teams and the players."
