The residential roofer explains that ice dams can prove disastrous for a roof, loosening shingles and tearing down the gutters. Water may accumulate and seep into the house. Ice dams can cause nasty damage, resulting in the peeling of paint, staining the ceiling, and warping the floor. The top Akron roof replacement company notes that the attic's wet insulation can turn into a hotbed for mold and mildew.

TK Roofing explains that ice dams result from ice accumulation along the edge of the roofline, vents, and skylight when the snow melts and freezes, preventing excess water from draining properly. The trouble starts when the temperatures start to rise, causing the ice to melt and pool up and get under the shingles. A professional residential roofer in Akron, Ohio, is the best person to get rid of ice dams.

The first step to deal with an ice dam is to blow cold air through the attic that points directly at the roof's affected area, advises TK Roofing and Gutters. "When you cool down the underside of your roof, your snow won't melt in the first place, keeping the ice dam from forming," says Daryl Gentry, owner of TK Roofing and gutters

The Akron roofer cautions homeowners against using a chisel or hammer to pick away the ice, advising them to use an aluminum rake with a long handle to remove clutter from gutters and roof. This makes the whole process safe, says TK Roofing and Gutters, adding that roof rakes with a wheel are the best option that does not pose damage to the roof.

?Raking snow and ice off of your roof will change the exterior temperature of your roof right away,? preventing the build-up of ice dams, states Daryl.

The locally-owned roof repair company, which was recently recognized as an Angie's List 2020 Super Award Winner, also suggests using a chemical deicer to speed up the melting of ice and prolong the life of shingles. Chemical deicers are available at local hardware stores in tablet or crystal form. The chemicals are easily distributed in the gutter and melt the ice.

One expensive yet excellent long-term prevention of ice dams is to use heated cables, they explain, which cost \$50-100 and are sold in most home improvement stores. ?Heated cables are proactive? and prevent ice dams from forming, but they must be installed before the first snowfall. It could cost \$600-900 to install heated cables, depending on the roof's size.
