If an elderly person is suffering from degenerative mental health diseases such as Alzheimer's or dementia, then they might need special professional help from those who are trained to provide care for such patients. If the parents tend to have lapses in memory or find it difficult to identify faces, it is a sign of dementia setting in.

Depending on the level of attention the parents need daily, there are two options one might consider. They can either move to an assisted living facility or a nursing home. An assisted living facility is one where the residents are given ample freedom to move around and socialize while critical tasks such as cooking food and taking medicines on time are handled by the staff. A nursing home offers a higher level of care. Nursing homes are equipped to take care of patients who are possibly infirm or bedridden. They offer round-the-clock attention and a staff that is medically trained.

Another option is hiring an in-home caregiver or moving the parents to live with the rest of the family. These options are often preferred as it does wonders for the mental state of an elderly person to be in a familiar environment surrounded by loved ones. Moving to an assisted living facility or nursing home often has detrimental effects on mental health and can be the root cause of conditions such as depression. In-home caregivers are also a great option for those that need help for just a couple of hours a day.
