Additionally, Alcohol Awareness Month was created as a way to help remove the stigma of alcohol addiction. Unfortunately, there are many people that still don't understand that alcoholism is a disease. Instead, they mistakenly believe that addiction is a choice or a moral failing. This is why the very first step in the 12-steps of Alcoholics Anonymous is "We admitted we were powerless over alcohol that our lives had become unmanageable".
