The "Florida Shuffle" as it's come to be known is when treatment center brokers prey on patients with good insurance and refer them to a revolving door of ineffective facilities, continually charging their insurance, while the patient is left often in worse condition than when they arrived.

Educating oneself on what to look for in a good addiction treatment center is the best way to avoid getting caught up in the unconscionable cycle of rehab deceptions.

Read reviews on third-party sources, such as Google, not just what's on the facility's website.

If the rehab is offering any incentive to come there, financial or otherwise, then there's likely something fishy going on. Also, if the facility is referring someone to a sober home with the promise of cash, clothes, gift cards, etc., they probably do not have patient's best interests in mind.

The treatment center should provide a variety of different therapies and programs to help people work through trauma and other underlying causes of addiction. Individual therapy is especially important, particularly at the beginning of treatment as it will help patients grow immensely.

Daily drug tests are unnecessary and can be costly as insurance will be billed for each one.

Check to see if the drug rehab facility is licensed and accredited. This is a clear indication of a quality facility because they have to adhere to strict guidelines to obtain these accreditations.

Ask about staff-to-patient ratios, licenses that doctors and nurses hold, and what out-of-pocket expenses can be expected to pay.
