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Cherry Hill, NJ - Since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, 57% of Americans reported an increase in substance abuse, with the largest increase in people between the ages of 35 to 44 years old, according to a recent study. The Coronavirus pandemic has affected millions of people over the past year who have suffered hardships from things like losing loved ones, unemployment, under-employment, and the stresses of working from home while caring for children. According to the CDC, 13% of Americans reported starting or increasing substance use as a way of coping with the stress associated with COVID-19 as of June 2020. They also found an 18% increase in nationwide overdoses.

A recent survey asked 1,000 adults about their drug and alcohol use in the previous month and found alcohol

was the most used substance followed by marijuana and then prescription opioids. Other substances included benzodiazepines, prescription stimulants, and cocaine. Additionally, 55% of those surveyed reported an increase in alcohol consumption and 18% reported a significant increase. 36% reported an increase in illicit drug use.

Part of the survey also asked people why they were inclined to use substances in the last month and over half said were trying to deal with stress. Other reasons were to ease boredom, to cope with mental health symptoms, such as anxiety or depression, for recreational reasons, to treat pain, or because it was part of their daily routine, for example, they were having a drink with dinner.

The survey results show that many people are turning to alcohol and drugs to deal with the stressors associated with the COVID-19 pandemic. Self-medicating to cope with stress, boredom, and mental health issues can lead to a substance use disorder if the habit continues. Co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders are extremely common.

During these times, it?s clear that good-quality addiction recovery and support services are more important than ever. Some other options that are available are recovery support groups, that have moved online for extra care, and telehealth services from therapists and doctors to help guide patients.
