Nearly 5% of children under the age of five are affected by food allergies. These can cause a range of issues, everything from rashes to breathing problems to fussiness/colic.

Cystic fibrosis is a genetic disorder that affects the lungs, digestive system, and other organs. It is a genetic disease and is passed down from parents. Babies with cystic fibrosis will not break down proteins correctly and will require specialty baby formula both for digestion and to aid in weight gain.

EoE (Eosinophilic Esophagitis) is a chronic allergic inflammatory disease of the esophagus that will require infants to drink a specialty baby formula. The symptoms often include nausea, regurgitation, vomiting, stomach pain, and heartburn.

GERD (Gastroesophageal Reflux Disease) is a condition in which babies spit up constantly and may display some colic-like symptoms including constant screaming which can be taxing on parent and baby. They may also frequently vomit and have a cough. A specialty baby formula may help these infants by providing a formula that is gentler on their digestive track and easier to break down.

The client's insurance will require a prescription from the child's pediatrician. A customer service specialist from Insurance Covered Baby Formula will work with the pediatrician to get the prescription. The company

will verify the client's insurance within 24 hours of receiving an order and the pediatrician's prescription.
