Because addiction is a disease that changes brain function, relapse is a possibility. Studies show that between 40-60% of individuals relapse once they have completed treatment. Recovery is a long-term, ongoing journey that lasts a lifetime. Addiction is a disease that cannot be cured, rather it can be put into a state of remission or recovery.
