The ever-popular Kids? Corner will once again provide meaningful activities for sprouting rockhounds to get

hands-on with rocks.

The main attraction for most will be the extensive vendor area where dealers from far and near will offer a

wide array of rocks, crystals, tumbled stones, gems, fossils, carvings, lapidary-related jewelry, home, and

garden décor, equipment, books, etc.

Over two dozen indoor vendors will fill the building with nearly 76 tables with another dozen or more outdoor

vendors with over 30 full tables committed.

Food and refreshments will be available on-site from food truck vendors courtesy of the State Fairgrounds.
