"Erectile dysfunction can cause stress, affect your self-confidence, and lead to relationship problems," says the article. "This can also cause stress which can cause ED to worsen. Issues sustaining an erection can also signify an underlying health condition like cardiovascular disease that needs treatment. If you're worried about your erectile dysfunction, you need to speak to a doctor. It's nothing to be embarrassed about, and you shouldn't ignore it because it could be a risk factor for heart disease. As far as 'cures' go, sometimes treating an underlying condition is enough to reverse erectile dysfunction. Or medications or other direct treatments might be needed."

Erectile dysfunction becomes more common for men as they get older, with 40% of men at the age of 40 experiencing some difficulty achieving an erection ? and that number nearly doubles by the age of 70. The condition can be reversed at any age, however, with proper treatment. In the simplest cases of erectile dysfunction, the issue might be blood pressure drugs, medications, recreational drugs, cigarettes, or alcohol. Being overweight or obese, stressed or anxious may also cause or exacerbate erectile issues. Weight loss and stress relief techniques can help to reduce the symptoms of erectile dysfunction.

The article says that about a quarter of all cases are the result of medications. "There are some antidepressants, especially SSRIs and SNRIs, drugs for indigestion, antihistamines, and some opioid painkillers that cause ED. Medications for Parkinson's disease, chemotherapies, and prostate cancer treatments can cause ED to a lesser degree. If you have started taking a new medication and experience ED, talk to the doctor who prescribed it to you. They might lower your dose or tell you to stop taking it altogether and switch you to another medication with a lower risk for ED," the article states.

Drugs and obesity are two other conditions that can cause erectile dysfunction, but, like with medications, it is possible to reverse the effects with the help of a men's health professional.
