This type of illegal activity affects every taxpayer and is a huge drain on the Medicare program. Because of the government's lack of resources and holding cheaters accountable, it has to often depend on individual healthcare employees in the industry to come forward with details so they can hold those who defraud the program liable.

"Fraud against the Medicare program may take many forms," stated the Kentucky healthcare whistleblower lawyer. "It can include manipulating healthcare records so as to earn more from Medicare, overcharging the government, providing second-rate products or services, and many other activities. The government counts on private whistleblowers to come forward with firsthand knowledge and proof of dishonest activities and the government compensates them for their vital support. Through qui tam claims, whistleblowers are able to bring civil claims against those celebrations on behalf of the government under the False Claims Act and can be rewarded for it."

The federal False Claims Act is a federal law that renders it criminal for any entity to make false Medicare claims or otherwise defraud the federal government. It additionally enables a medical worker with knowledge of scams against the Medicare program to file a whistleblower suit on behalf of the federal government. In exchange for their info and effort, the whistleblowers may be entitled to collect incentives of between 15% to 30% of the recuperation by the federal government. The act additionally has provisions for whistleblower safeguards against any company retribution which may result from submitting a claim or agreeing to work with the government.

When a whistleblower comes forward with information and facts regarding Medicare fraud, the case is filed in federal district court. It is put 'under seal' while the Department of Justice investigates the claim and the evidence speaks with witnesses and talks to specialists and agency personnel. The federal government will then make a decision if it will intervene. If the government does not choose to participate, the whistleblower still may continue the case by themselves.

Because health care employees may put themselves personally at risk doing this crucial work, the federal False Claims Act highly incentivizes them with a significant portion of the monetary recovery. In a successful claim, the federal government can recuperate approximately three times its losses in addition to penalties for each event of scams.
