Portland, OR, is the state's largest city and the seat of Multnomah County. As of the time of writing, the county has recorded almost 61000 coronavirus cases and has witnessed around 850 deaths. The first confirmed case in Multnomah County was recorded on March 10, 2020. By April 1, the number of cases in the Portland metro area had risen to over 30. The city managed to pull through the first wave of the coronavirus with a fewer number of cases per day as compared to other major hotspots around the country. However, the number of cases hit its all-time peak at the start of December 2020 with the 7-day average reaching 420. The situation stabilized as the number of cases dropped steadily all through 2021, rising once in mid-April 2021, and then once again in September 2021, though never close to the stark levels that it had touched in December 2020.

City and county officials followed all the recommendations made by authoritative bodies such as the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Multnomah County Health Department, and the Oregon Health Authority. Common areas of interest such as community centers, sports facilities, and libraries were closed off to the public. The city also stepped up its attempts to shore up healthcare infrastructure to prepare for the influx of coronavirus cases. For example, the Oregon Convention Center was converted to a temporary shelter with around 140 beds. On March 17, Oregon Governor Kate Brown banned in-house consumption across Oregon. On March 23, Governor Brown issued an executive order requiring home isolation for the state's residents with scant exceptions for essential services.

The stay-at-home orders and the eventual shutting down of several businesses, especially those in the leisure and hospitality sector, led to an unemployment rate of 13.4% for Multnomah County in June 2020. This was over 10% more than the unemployment rate same time last year. The hospitality industry was severely hit as Travel Portland reported in early April 2020 that there was a decrease of almost 80% in demand for lodging and occupancy in Portland. The city's sporting calendar was also affected as prominent organizations such as the National Basketball Association (NBA), Major League Soccer (MLS), and National Women's Soccer League canceled games planned for the season. The schools in the state were shut down as early as March 31, 2020, and then on April 8, the school closures were extended through to the end of the 2019-2020 school year.
