Sleep apnea may also be diagnosed by another person who monitors the patient while they are sleeping.

Some of the factors that increase the risk of a person developing the disorder include excess weight, neck

circumference, narrowed airways due to narrow throats, enlarged tonsils, or adenoids, gender (males are two to three times more likely to have sleep apnea), age (risk increases with age), family history, use of alcohol, sedatives, or tranquilizers, smoking habits, nasal congestion, and other underlying medical conditions.

A CPAP machine is the primary device that is often prescribed to those suffering from sleep apnea disorders. A CPAP machine sends a steady supply of oxygen to the person?s nose and mouth through a mask as they sleep, keeping the airways open and helping them breathe normally. CPAP machines have compressors that generate a continuous stream of pressurized air that travels through an air filter into a flexible tube.

There are a few different types of CPAP machines. A regular CPAP machine is programmed to deliver pressurized air at a steady pressure level. An APAP (Automatic Positive Airflow Pressure) machine checks the person?s breathing while they sleep and adjusts the air pressure to compensate for changes in their sleep position or breathing. A BiPAP (Bi-level Positive Airflow Pressure) machine has two pressure settings, one pressure for inhaling and a lower pressure for exhaling. A BiPAP machine is ideal for those with elevated carbon dioxide levels or those that can?t tolerate CPAP machines.
