

# UJB8 Released Jailbreak and Unlock for iPhone 6 and 5 on iOS 8.1.2 That Includes Cydia

The Ujb8 team has delivered an untethered iOS 8 ? 8.1.2 jailbreak when it was least expected for iPhone 6,5S,5C,5,4S and iPad Air 2,3,4. Having surprised us with the impromptu jailbreak for iOS 8.1.1, the team has come through with another solution for the all-new iOS 8.x. As mentioned in the initial coverage, dubbed as Ujb8, it works with iOS 8.0 all the way through to the latest iOS 8.1.1, and below, they are showing how to jailbreak the idevice using the tool. The update now includes Cydia as well.

iOS 8.1.2 can be jailbroken using the existing 8.1.1 exploits (for example the untethered approach from the team, which remains valid after this update to the OS). The normal practice in dealing with jailbreaks has been to close the exploits down at the next update. Jailbreak methods come and go as Cupertino?s mobile operating system keeps bumping up the version numbers.

The official team's website is: [Unlok-Jailbreak.net](http://Unlok-Jailbreak.net) and the Software has been downloaded by over 250,000 customers located worldwide and it can succesfully Jailbreak iPhone 6,5S,5C iOS 8.1.1 and iPhone 4,4S or iPad Air,4,3,2. One good advantage of the software is that the jailbreaking process is completely reversible and there will be no evidence that the iPhone has been jailbroken. It is a process that allows removing any limitations imposed on iPad, iPhone users by Apple and it helps them to gain access to the command line of the operating system 8.1.1 and 8.0.2 to iOS 8.

ios 8.1.1 Jailbreak.

Experts say ?On iPhone peoples don?t have to be tied to any single cell phone carrier.? Instead, they can easily switch between carriers to capitalize on deals or take advantage of a sale. Users can save dollars in roaming charges by slipping a different SIM card into their phone while abroad.

These apps will no doubt work on earlier firmwares too, but they have been designed for the new iOS 8.1.2 and people should run them on the new devices too.

There's also no word if iOS 8.2 will address issues such as high power drain, wi-fi connectivity issues, bluetooth compatibility, or many of the other issues that are having a direct impact on the day to day life of iOS users. Given the OS update issues that have affected some users, especially on handsets with lower storage specifications, pushing out another update to fix the purchased ringtones issue questions where Tim Cook's Apple has its focus.

As such iOS 8.1.2 isn't the major fix users still plagued by ongoing iOS 8 problems vevve been hoping for. iOS 8.1.1 released in November fixed bugs for many users, but swathes of users remain affected by issues ranging from crippled WiFi (a main support thread for this is now over 93 pages long),Bluetooth bugs stopping connection to headsets and car kits and chronic battery drain. In this context Apple's decision to address a ringtones bug first will no doubt cause anger, regardless of whether it is low hanging fruit.
