While many might recognise pain in the jaw or gums as a sign that they need to seek professional help, certain patients might also consider the pain to be temporary, or that it will eventually fade on its own given enough time. In some cases, this can be dangerous, and prompt action can mean the difference between recovery and lost teeth or worse.

It is widely understood that we all need to visit the dentist on a regular basis, the clinic states, and you should consider that this is serious enough that even dentists go to a professional they trust for their own check ups instead of attempting to carry it out themselves. However, it can be a bit more difficult to identify when at-home or over-the-counter remedies are not enough, and failing to do so can lead to drastic consequences. We strongly advise that you take the time to familiarise yourself with the signs so you will know when to call your dentist for an emergency appointment.

Acacia Dental Group says pain is often a great motivator, but it is not the only sign people should look out for. If they notice swelling of their gum, cheek or face (that is spreading); uncontrollable bleeding that cannot be

stopped or even clear signs of major damage (such as a knocked out or broken tooth), they should make every attempt to see their dentist as soon as possible. While these are by no means the only symptoms of deeper issues, the clinic emphasises that any delay can only make matters worse, so anyone who is not sure they need emergency treatment should err on the side of caution and call their dentist for more advice.

Everyone should also be aware that dental emergencies may require more serious attention. If a person is experiencing difficulty breathing, has lost consciousness or has rapid serious bleeding, their first stop should be at their closest A&E.

Notably, a patient may wish to consider visiting Acacia Dental Group if they require emergency dentistry in Woden, particularly if it would be their first visit. In addition to offering world-class dental treatment, initial consultations are always free, so a patient would only have to pay for their treatment. Since the practice will also take the opportunity to give them every available treatment option and allow them to choose which they prefer, patients also have the luxury of determining which course their treatment will take. Should they wish, in fact, they can decline treatment altogether.
