That's because more doctors are starting to make the switch from traditional methadone-based medically assisted treatments to ones that make use of buprenorphine instead. It's a subject that a representative of this Browns Mill Road rehab center wanted to discuss further. The representative stated, "Here at our reputable Johnson City, Tennessee recovery center, we are always striving to stay up to date on the latest ways to better help those who come to us for help overcoming their opioid abuse disorders. A good example of that is our doctors use more patient-friendly medications such as buprenorphine as part of our medication-assisted treatments."

The representative continued by saying that opioid use has become a big concern in the USA over the last several decades. It's thought to have played a major role in the deaths of over 80,000 people in 2021 alone.

He pointed out that's why it's so important for those with opioid use disorder to seek help from an established treatment facility such as theirs. Methadone-assisted treatments have long been used to help those trying to break an opioid abuse habit avoid some of the more worrisome and problematic withdrawal symptoms during treatment. Now that is starting to change as doctors are more often prescribing buprenorphine (Suboxone®) as an alternative to methadone-based medicine-assisted treatments. ReVIDA Recovery® of Johnson City's representative went on to discuss the main reasons for this change. It all starts with the fact that buprenorphine (Suboxone®) was explicitly created to help with opioid cessation and its accompanying withdrawal symptoms. He mentioned that because of this, it has a ceiling effect that does not allow those on the medicine to experience a high while taking it to help counteract their opioid withdrawal symptoms. It also makes this medicine much less prone to patient misuse and overdosing and is thought to be much less addictive at the same time.

Another favorable trait that accompanies buprenorphine-assisted treatments is that these treatments can start right away at a patient's home instead of them have to be initially performed under the watchful eye of a doctor as methadone-assisted treatments require. A recent study even showed that those who have switched from using methadone to buprenorphine in opioid medicine-assisted treatments experienced very few side effects from that process. That's why the experienced doctors that oversee opioid use disorder treatments at ReVIDA Recovery® are using buprenorphine (Suboxone®) more often to help those living with heroin, oxycodone, hydrocodone, morphine, oxycontin, Percocet, Lortab, Roxicodone, and fentanyl use disorders.
