The lawyer mentions that Medicare still covers the medical services an individual may need beyond nursing care along with institutional Medicaid. Medicare usually pays first if the person needs to see a specialist or visit a doctor?s office. Then, Medicaid covers the remaining costs such as copayments, coinsurances, and deductibles.

Attorney Whitney L. Thompson adds that for families with a loved one who needs more care than they are able to provide but not enough to get them admitted to a nursing home, there is an in-between care type provided in assisted living. However, Medicaid usually does not cover this type of care or is very limited.

In the article, the lawyer says, ?Nursing homes are experiencing very limited capacity, and waitlists can be years. Medicaid is adapting to provide this coverage type in-home to those applicants who may meet NFLOC

Medicaid eligibility requirements but not pose a danger to themselves or others in a home environment.

Perhaps using this as a springboard as a potential nursing home residence is waitlisted for full-time care.?

Lastly, the lawyer emphasizes the importance of having a skilled Medicaid planning attorney when dealing
