The article discusses how 'in most cases, colour dye transfer can be removed just by using conventional leather cleaning products.' The article also points out that 'if the dye has been in contact with the leather for too long, it might have penetrated the surface of the leather, making it harder to remove the stain just by cleaning, in which case a dye might be needed to restore the leather.'

The article states that 'The first step should always be to try to remove dye stains with something like Colourlock Mild Leather Cleaner or for more stubborn stains Colourlock Strong Leather Cleaner.' The article also cautions that 'after using the cleaner, if the stain hasn't completely been removed, one might need to also apply a product such as Colourlock GLD Solvent.'
