"The talk," as many in the community have come to call it, refers to a specific type of conversation an STI-positive individual would eventually have with their romantic partner, especially if sexual activity was possible in the near future. In this conversation, they would reveal their status to their partner. Given the nature of STIs and the stigma many still carry, this conversation can be awkward at best, and it may even lead to the end of the relationship altogether. As such, it is seen as a risk, albeit a necessary one.

"You have to talk to your partner about your status at some point," notes [Meetpositives.com](#), "especially if the relationship is about to get physical. However, it being necessary will not make it any easier for you to do so, given the potential ramifications. Fortunately, our members have found that there is no need to have the talk when this information is freely provided before they ever get in touch. Once you start using the website, you will similarly find that people who share your condition will not carry the same stigma that others might. In other words, you're more free to be yourself " without the shadow of such difficult conversations looming over you."

STIs are more common than most may think, with herpes infecting a massive number of people in the US alone. Around 50 to 80 percent of American adults have oral herpes (HSV-1). This form of herpes is mostly asymptomatic, but symptoms may include cold sores or fever blisters in or around the mouth. On the other hand, genital herpes, caused by HSV-1 or HSV-2, affects one out of every six people in the US (aged 14 to 49). These figures are one reason the team identified the need for a herpes dating website.

The platform adds, "It is very likely that you or someone you know has herpes or another STI, but a positive diagnosis does not have to ruin your life. With the appropriate medications, many are manageable, if not curable, and the risk of transmission can be limited as well.
