

SUBSTANCE ABUSE

Substance abuse (also known as drug abuse) is a patterned use of a drug in which the user consumes the substance in amounts or with methods which are harmful to themselves or others, and in a form of substance-related disorder. Widely differing definitions of drug abuse are used in public health, medical and criminal justice contexts. In some cases, criminal or anti-social behavior occurs when the person is under the influence of a drug, and long-term personality changes (in individuals) may occur as well [2]. In addition to possible physical, social, and psychological harm, use of some drugs may also lead to criminal penalties, although these vary widely depending on the local jurisdiction.



COST



EUROPE

This was reported by 10 countries categorized according to the functions of government, amounting to a total of EUR 2.17 billion. Overall, the highest proportion of this total came within the government functions of Health (60%) (e.g. medical services), and Public Order and Safety (PCS) (20%) (e.g. police services, law courts, prisons).



UNITED KINGDOM

The UK Home Office estimated that the social and economic cost of drug abuse in the UK economy in terms of crime, absences and lost wages, is a total of £2 billion a year [2]. However, the UK Home Office does not estimate what portion of those crimes are unintended consequences of drug prohibition. Estimates to sustain expensive drug consumption, risky production and dangerous distribution, not what is the cost of enforcement.



UNITED STATES

These figures represent overall consumer costs, which can be divided in three major categories: health care, criminal justice expenditures.

Health-related costs were projected to total \$16 billion in 2002. Productivity losses were estimated at \$128.6 billion. In contrast to other costs of drug abuse (which involve direct expenditures for goods and services), this value reflects a loss of potential earnings of the individual workers. The total cost of drug abuse has been performed about the impact of drug abuse that was never performed, but could otherwise be expected to include alternative productivity losses due to:

- Health care: \$16 billion
 - Productivity losses: \$128.6 billion
 - Criminal justice: \$1.4 billion
 - Law enforcement: \$1.4 billion
 - Loss of life: \$1.4 billion
- The non-health care expenditures primarily concern costs associated with the criminal justice system and crime victim costs, but also include a modest level of expenses for administrative costs of the social welfare system. The total cost of drug abuse at \$142 billion, the largest overall component of drug costs in the state and federal governments at \$14.2 billion, which is primarily for the operation of prisons. Another \$26 billion was devoted for state judicial police protection, followed by \$6.2 billion for federal supply reduction initiatives.

IMMIGRANTS AND REFUGEES

Immigrant and refugees have often been under great stress (e.g. physical trauma and depression and anxiety due to separation from loved ones and traumatic the fear of language barriers, racism, discrimination, economic adversity, overcrowding, social isolation and the and difficulty obtaining work and forms of education and culture).



STREET CHILDREN

Street children in many developing countries are a high risk group for substance misuse, in particular heroin abuse (WHO). Drawing on research on drug use amongst street children in Kenya, Cohen found that the women against the hardship of life on the street, they use drugs as a coping mechanism and as a symbol of family honor group as a protest against the harshness of their situation [3].



MUSICIANS

In order to maintain high-quality performance, some musicians take drugs to deal with the stress of performing. As a group they have a higher rate of alcohol abuse, overmedication, and other health problems which is caused by drug musicians in their profession because of the psychological effects.



VETERANS

Substance abuse can be another contributing factor that affects physical and mental health of veterans. Substance abuse may also increase the risk of mental health problems and lead to financial difficulties. There is evidence to suggest that substance abuse disproportionately affects the homeless veteran population.
