

RPost Believes Hillary Clinton Needs RMail For Secure eMail

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RPost has revealed that what Hillary Clinton really needs is RMail to secure her email. After Mrs. Clinton left the U.S. State Department, she set up a private email infrastructure. Supposedly, this has a number of excellent security features in place to protect it from hackers and other malicious intent. It also means that various confidential email addresses could now be available to hackers and other internet spies.

The information that has been provided was released by cyber security experts. They have also claimed that there are multiple security gaps in the clintonemail.com server. Essentially, when the server was set up, the SPF (Sender Policy Framework) was not turned on. In doing so, a hacker could have easily sent a virus to all the world leaders, posing as Hillary Clinton. According to RPost, this situation shows the importance of having encrypted email services on top of regular security.

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
