These include wrist fracture, ganglion cyst, carpal tunnel syndrome, vascular problems, hand and wrist sports injuries, and ligament injuries. They recommend seeing a wrist specialist if a person is suffering from symptoms such as chronic wrist pain, discomfort, or difficulty in doing daily chores. It is advisable to consult with wrist and hand specialists when suffering from bruising, tenderness, tingling, and swelling in the hand or wrist.

Some of the symptoms to look out for are: difficulty straightening wrist; difficulty or pain when twisting the wrist; inability to open, carry, or twist objects; swelling or tenderness; tingling in wrist, forearm, or fingers; and pain when performing daily tasks. An orthopedic specialist can provide treatment for these conditions through medication, surgery, therapy, or some combination of the three.

There are various kinds of wrist fractures of which the most common is the distal radial fracture, which arises

when the bones of the wrist and the longer radius meet. When the wrist and thumb meet, that is a scaphoid fracture. Both of these fractures may be resolved using a cast if treated early. If not, a kind of surgery known as wrist arthroscopy, may be needed.

Carpal tunnel syndrome occurs when pressure is exerted on the median nerve that is found in the wrist. Symptoms of this condition include numbness and tingling of the wrist, hand, or forearm. If the symptoms are making the performance of daily tasks difficult, it may be advisable to consult a doctor. Treatment may be minimal and sometimes, simply avoiding certain activities can help in mitigating the pain. However, in some situations, carpal tunnel surgery, which is highly effective and minimally invasive, may be required.

In a ganglion cyst, a small fluid-filled sac develops over a tendon or joint. This cyst is filled with a dense fluid and an orthopedist may be able to treat the cyst through aspiration or full removal.

Vascular problems may occur when the flow of blood to the nerves or tissues in the hand is interrupted. The symptoms, which are usually known as ischemia, include pain, tingling, numbness, or a heavy feeling in the affected area. Most of these cases can be treated with medication, diet changes, or lifestyle changes, although some surgery may be needed.

Meanwhile, hand and wrist injuries are quite common in athletes. These injuries may include tendonitis, ligament strains, and overuse injuries. They need to be treated as early as possible to avoid prolonged recovery and make sure that the hands and wrists will be able to function correctly. Possible treatments include counseling, physical therapy, and the use of casts or braces.

Ligament injuries usually involve a torn ligament or tendon in the wrist or a wrist sprain. Symptoms of these injuries include soreness, aching pain, tenderness, and acute pain at the time of injury. Treatment as early as possible is recommended to avoid prolonged healing or worsening of the pain.
