

to any building, road, highway, excavation, railroad, or any other type of structure in the state has to be licensed by the CSLB if the total cost of labor and materials or one or more contracts is at least \$500. For the CSLB to grant a license to an individual, that person has to pass the licensing exam.

CSLB can provide a license to contractors as general builders, general engineering contractors, or in more specialized trades, including well drilling, framing, masonry, or landscaping. Contractors, including specialty contractors, subcontractors, and those who are in the home improvement industry need to be licensed before they are allowed to submit bids. Licenses may be issued to individuals, partnerships, corporations, joint ventures, and limited liability companies.
