"Aside from the sound of rushing water, pipes should be quiet," says Wimpey. "A rattling sound in the pipes,

particularly right after shutting off a valve, could be water hammer." Wimpey goes on to explain that ?When

the flow of water abruptly stops or changes direction, a shock wave is created which can lead to hammering

sounds. Water hammer can be due to high water pressure, poorly secured pipes, or flooded air chambers.?

Other potential signs of plumbing issues in the home include frequently clogged or gurgling toilets and

peeling or cracked paint in the bathroom. Additionally, rising water bills are usually a sign that there is a major

leak occurring. Calling a plumber when noticing any of these signs is the best course of action for

homeowners.
