Everything must be cleaned thoroughly and any toxic materials collected need to be removed using proper methods to avoid any further damage, and stop any possibility of future problems.

In order for survivors of violent crime to be able to move back into their homes, or workers to re-enter the workplace, any and all dangers must be removed to prevent illness, or disease. Many times the responsibility of cleaning up a murder, or suicide scene reverts to the family, or loved ones of the victim after all of the official police business has concluded.
