Sealing cracks with weatherproof caulking and using peppermint or eucalyptus essential oils around pumpkins can act as a natural deterrent. Fruit flies not only swarm but may lay eggs on decomposing organic matter, multiplying the problem.

Eliminate Fruit Flies Naturally: To prevent an infestation, place a vinegar trap near the pumpkin by filling a bowl with apple cider vinegar, covering it with plastic wrap, and poking holes in the top. This attracts fruit flies and traps them in the solution. Additionally, small bowls of beer or wine work similarly, luring flies in without the need for chemical sprays.

Additional Tips for Pumpkin Safety: Keeping a pumpkin fresh is key to avoiding pest issues. Avoid carving pumpkins too far in advance, and if possible, bring them indoors at night to extend their freshness. Homeowners should also check their pumpkins regularly for signs of decay. If pumpkins start to look wrinkled or smell fermented, it's time to dispose of them in a compost pile or green bin.
