"Buildings filled with organic matter like wood and drywall create the perfect environment for mold growth."

Health Implications of Mold Exposure: The health effects of mold exposure can be diverse and debilitating. Homeowners may report experiencing odd health problems shortly after moving into a new home, such as swollen eyes and lips, headaches, random body hives, ear infections, extreme fatigue, and trouble focusing. These symptoms often lead to a doctor's visit, where mold is identified as the culprit.

"People's reactions vary depending on individual predispositions to mold and the type of mold growth," notes Andy. "Some individuals may experience no symptoms, while others may suffer from sore throats, itchy eyes, memory loss, heightened asthma problems, headaches, sneezing, skin rashes, and in severe cases, autoimmune diseases due to prolonged exposure."

**Identifying Mold in the Home:** Detecting mold in a home can be challenging, as it often hides behind the scenes. The most obvious signs of mold growth include visible damp, dark, or fuzzy patches on surfaces. Homeowners often discover mold in their home through such visible signs.

However, mold can also be detected through its distinct odor. "There may be a musty or mildew scent, and certain species of mold can even give off pungent cat urine odors," Andy Jennings warns.

Even without visible signs, health issues can serve as a warning sign. If family members experience unexplained symptoms, it's essential to consider the possibility of mold growth at home.

**Causes of Mold Growth:** Moisture is the primary catalyst for mold growth, and water intrusion or damp conditions can create the perfect storm for mold infestations. Common causes include pipe bursts, flooding from rain or storms, water leaks from faulty roofs or unsealed windows, and humid crawl spaces, attics, or basements.

Andy Jennings emphasizes, "Many homeowners mistakenly believe that if they see mold in an isolated area, that's where the mold issue is contained. But identifying the root cause and addressing the source of water or humidity is key."

**Effective Mold Remediation Strategies:** Addressing mold growth requires a multifaceted approach, from identifying the type and severity of mold to implementing effective remediation strategies. Andy Jennings recommends consulting with a professional mold remediation specialist to ensure a comprehensive and impartial assessment.

"Remediating mold isn't a one-size-fits-all solution," he explains. "A mold expert can help identify the types of mold, the severity of the issue, and the best way to address it."

For minor mold growth, Andy suggests using hydrogen peroxide to address mold in small amounts in common areas like shower grout. However, he cautions against using bleach, as it can contribute to mold growth on porous surfaces like drywall.

When dealing with more severe mold infestations, professional remediators employ dry fog and specially designed products to eliminate mycotoxins from the home. Whole-home mold remediation projects can cost

several thousand to tens of thousands of dollars, depending on the severity of the problem, its location and cause, and the process of removing the mold.

**Preventive Measures for Mold-Free Homes:** Preventing mold growth in a home requires proactive measures to maintain a dry and healthy environment. Andy Jennings advises homeowners to address water intrusion from flooding, roof leaks, or pipe bursts immediately, ensuring the affected areas are properly dried out and using mold sprays or hydrogen peroxide to reduce the chances of mold growth.

"Keep your home dry by using proper dehumidifiers or a humidity meter to monitor levels in the home," he recommends. "Regular maintenance of the HVAC system, including changing out filters and running it often, is also essential." Addressing ongoing water intrusion issues, such as flooding in the crawl space, is crucial to prevent mold from returning.

**Navigating Mold Issues in Real Estate Transactions:** Mold can have a significant impact on real estate transactions, affecting both buyers and sellers. "Any major defect, including mold, can break a deal or have a big impact on negotiations when buying a home," says Andy Jennings. "Aside from the potential health issues, mold will continue to devalue a property until the problem becomes so rampant that the home is uninhabitable."

For those involved in a real estate transaction, it's essential to understand the laws regarding the disclosure of home defects. "The law in most states generally requires disclosing all known defects and any issue which materially affects the value of the property, including evidence of mold in the home," Andy explains. "Providing details of a previous inspection, mold lab test results, or even simply stating that stains on a wall might be mold could be considered sufficient disclosure."

Evidence of mold will change the way sellers can negotiate, but it's better than being found guilty of nondisclosure. Buyers and sellers can agree upon a reduction in the sale price, allowing the buyer to make repairs, or negotiate that the seller make repairs before closing or before the buyer takes possession of the home.
