Not only does it have no discernable smell or taste, but using these methods would involve you potentially consuming the substance which isn?t recommended.?

Even though fentanyl can not be detected with the naked eye, Serenity Lane provides a safe alternative to spot it. ?Through the use of fentanyl test strips, you can test for fentanyl in any substance you have? While these strips can be helpful, it?s important to note that they?re not perfect. When cocaine is laced with fentanyl, the substance won?t be evenly distributed amongst the substance. This means you could test a portion of some cocaine that is fentanyl free, but test another portion of the same cocaine and find fentanyl within it.?
