

Vines Heating & Air, Plumbing, Restoration Expands Services to Include HVAC

Vines Heating & Dir, Plumbing, Restoration has expanded its service offerings to include HVAC coverage. The expansion follows a review of service needs along the South Carolina coast, with North Myrtle Beach identified as a community requiring additional heating and cooling support.

The company, which has provided plumbing and restoration services in the region, determined through internal assessments that HVAC-related calls had grown steadily. These requests often involved both residential and commercial properties, highlighting a gap in local service availability.

?HVAC requests in this area have been consistently high, and our decision to expand into this category reflects those trends,? said Harleigh Roach, spokesperson for Vines Heating & Earney; Air, Plumbing, Restoration. ?The move was based on documented patterns in service demand.?

The introduction of HVAC services includes assigning technician coverage to North Myrtle Beach, updating dispatch routes, and preparing service vehicles with the parts and tools most frequently required for heating and cooling system repairs. These operational changes are intended to address the recurring issues

identified in recent evaluations.

Common concerns in the review included reduced air conditioning performance during summer, inconsistent heating output in older furnaces, and ventilation challenges across both residential and commercial spaces. In homes built several decades ago, aging equipment often required more extensive repairs, while newer developments produced requests involving system calibration, thermostat adjustments, and maintenance checks.

Commercial buildings added another layer of demand. Offices, retail establishments, and hospitality properties in North Myrtle Beach reported HVAC issues tied to larger, multi-zone systems. These systems required different preparation and resources than residential properties, influencing how the new service coverage was structured.

The company has indicated that it will monitor several performance indicators during the rollout. These include appointment response times, first-visit completion rates, and service call durations. Monitoring these metrics will allow adjustments to be made if further refinements are needed.

Roach noted that the expansion into HVAC services is part of a wider review of community needs along the Grand Strand. ?Every community has its own set of infrastructure characteristics and service trends,? Roach said. ?North Myrtle Beach was one of the areas where HVAC requests were consistently strong.?

Environmental conditions factored into the review as well. Coastal South Carolina experiences extended periods of heat and humidity in the summer, combined with occasional cold spells in the winter. These seasonal changes increase the importance of reliable heating and cooling systems, and the demand data from North Myrtle Beach reflected this reality.

The housing mix in the community also contributed to the findings. Established neighborhoods often produced service calls involving long-used systems, while newer residential developments showed needs tied to recently installed equipment requiring maintenance or adjustment. Together, these service patterns demonstrated the value of including HVAC within the company?s service scope.

The addition of HVAC coverage in North Myrtle Beach is part of an ongoing process to adapt services to local conditions. Similar evaluations are taking place in surrounding communities, where adjustments may be introduced based on documented service demand and infrastructure considerations.

The expansion also brings HVAC, plumbing, and restoration services under one provider in the area, allowing the company to respond to a wider range of property needs. While the operational rollout is still in its early stages, the introduction of HVAC reflects a response to clear demand in the community.

By basing its expansion decisions on service call data, system age, and infrastructure patterns, Vines Heating & Air, Plumbing, Restoration continues to refine its approach to regional service coverage. The addition of HVAC services in North Myrtle Beach represents one step in this broader effort to align operations with the specific conditions and needs of coastal South Carolina communities.
