According to an article on the SixWise website, each year, about 20,000 individuals pass on and 21 million therapeutic visits are required because of home accidents in the United States, says the U.S. Home Safety Council. Those most at danger are kids and the elderly - a late report from Harvard Medical School found that the possibility of dying from a home accident increments significantly after the age of 65. Indeed, individuals beyond 75 four years old four times more prone to die from a home accident than those matured 65 to 74.

According to the article, to have a finger crushed in a slamming door is number 2 on their list of top six

accidents waiting to happen in the home. The author stated, "slamming fingers in doors can be especially dangerous for kids, whose tiny fingers could be crushed or even amputated if they get caught in a door, particularly the hinge side, or window. In fact, a study published in the Annals of Emergency Medicine found that in children aged 4 and younger, three out of four finger amputations resulted from fingers that were caught, jammed or crushed in an opening or closing door."
