



agileKRC Launches agilekrc.org to Provide Organisations with Practical Agile Consulting, Coaching, and Certified Training

agileKRC has launched agilekrc.org in London to consolidate and expand access to practical Agile consulting, coaching, and certified training for organisations across sectors. The launch brings together decades of delivery experience with recognised methods to address how teams plan, prioritise, and deliver outcomes in complex environments. The aim is to support leaders, project managers, and delivery teams with approaches that balance structure and adaptability, reflecting growing demand for Agile skills that improve predictability and value. The new website serves as a hub for information on services, methodologies, and course options, including AgilePM and PRINCE2 Agile, alongside insight articles and guidance derived from real-world programmes. Attention to execution and context often determines whether Agile initiatives succeed, and the organisation's latest move emphasises implementation over rhetoric. Gao added that the resource aims to demystify terminology and link methods to measurable outcomes, noting that course descriptions, case notes, and consultancy options are presented with an emphasis on clarity. The aim is to allow readers to compare pathways and understand how techniques such as iterative planning, timeboxing, and incremental release policies can coexist with established reporting and compliance needs.

The website at agilekrc.org sets out service areas, training routes, and background material that explain how Agile practices can be tuned to industry-specific constraints. The content highlights where iterative delivery can reduce lead times without undermining assurance, and where hybrid approaches maintain governance while improving responsiveness. Readers who wish to examine course outlines or explore advisory engagements can review options and request further information without obligation, with links to detailed descriptions and public course schedules. For those comparing frameworks, the site outlines distinctions between AgilePM and PRINCE2 Agile, indicating typical use cases, roles, and artefacts. Over the coming period, the organisation anticipates that interest will continue to move toward hybrid models that pair incremental delivery with formal governance, especially in regulated domains. By setting out pragmatic guidance and formal training pathways, the site is positioned to support teams that need to prove value early while maintaining compliance, offering a reference for those aiming to move from pilot initiatives

to sustained portfolio-wide adoption.
