With experience in SEO, digital marketing, and public relations, Lano's work focuses on identifying effective programs. "My work has always been about experimenting and finding what truly works, then simplifying it for others," he said. "The entrepreneurial journey can be isolating, and reliable guidance is helpful. The shift we're seeing with AI, evolving customer behaviors, and new prototyping tools is creating a sense of urgency. Entrepreneurs need to adapt not just their business models, but their own mindset, to stay relevant."
