As winter nears in Michigan, SERVPRO of Eaton, Clinton, & Gratiot Counties, & Lansing & Holt provides essential tips for property owners to prevent damage from cold weather events. This initiative addresses the risks posed by freezing temperatures, heavy snow, and ice, which have historically led to significant property losses across the state. Michigan has experienced 60 billion-dollar weather and climate disasters from 1980 to 2024, including seven winter storms that caused extensive damage. Recent data indicates that winter weather resulted in an estimated \$61.8 million in property damage nationwide in 2024. In 2022, winter storms accounted for nearly \$6 billion in insured losses across the United States. Earlier in 2025, the Northern Michigan Ice Storm from March 28 to 30 caused widespread power outages, loss of communication services, and blocked roads due to downed trees and debris in affected areas.

SERVPRO recommends several practical steps to mitigate these risks. Property owners should maintain indoor temperatures at least at 65 degrees to prevent pipes from freezing, which can lead to bursts and subsequent water damage. Insulating exposed pipes, particularly in unheated areas like basements, attics, and garages, helps protect against cold snaps that are common in Michigan winters. Disconnecting outdoor

hoses and sealing drafts around windows and doors further reduces the chance of freezing-related issues. Servicing heating systems annually ensures efficient operation and minimizes fire hazards from malfunctioning equipment. Regular inspections of roofs and gutters are vital to prevent ice dams, which form when melting snow refreezes at the roof's edge, potentially causing water to back up under shingles and into the structure. Clearing gutters of leaves and debris allows proper drainage and avoids such backups.

In addition, removing snow accumulation from roofs prevents structural strain, especially on flat or low-slope designs where snow should be cleared before it reaches 12 inches in depth. Using a telescopic roof rake with a plastic tip can aid in safe removal without damaging the roofing material. Property owners should also inspect and remove dead or rotting trees near structures to avoid branches falling under the weight of ice or snow, which could cause significant harm to buildings or vehicles. Chimney maintenance, including professional cleaning and inspection, reduces the risk of fires from creosote buildup in wood-burning systems commonly used during cold months. Preparing an emergency kit with essentials like flashlights, batteries, non-perishable food, and blankets equips households for potential power outages.

These measures align with the company's expertise in handling the aftermath of winter-related incidents.
