According to data, the state ranked third in the nation for frozen pipe losses in a previous analysis. A small crack in a pipe can release over 250 gallons of water per day, affecting floors, walls, and personal belongings. Ice dams form when snow melts and refreezes on roofs, blocking drainage and allowing water to seep into structures. Heavy snow accumulation also poses risks, potentially causing roof collapses or damage from fallen trees and limbs. These events contribute to billions in damages annually across the country, with water-related claims being a frequent occurrence.

The company notes that preventive measures can mitigate these risks. Homeowners and business operators should insulate pipes in unheated areas, allow faucets to drip during extreme cold, and maintain consistent

indoor temperatures. For roofs, ensuring proper insulation and ventilation helps prevent ice dam formation. Regular inspections of foundations for cracks can address potential entry points for melting snow. In commercial settings, similar precautions apply, with added emphasis on monitoring large roof areas and drainage systems.

When damage occurs, prompt response is essential to limit further issues, such as mold growth from lingering moisture.
