



## **SolarEnergies.ca Report Redefines Popular Vancouver Solar Installer in Post-Grant Market**

With solar panel systems carrying 25-year performance warranties, the report questions what that warranty is worth if the installer disappears. The investigation found that a company's history and install volume are now primary indicators of value.

"A 25-year warranty from a company that's only been around for two years is just a piece of paper," Lano commented. "I wanted this report to show homeowners how to spot real, tangible security. The data shows a stunning difference between a 2-year workmanship warranty from a high-volume company like Polaron and a 25-year workmanship guarantee from a service-focused company like Shift Energy. That guarantee is an asset."

The report highlights the "workmanship warranty" - the installer's guarantee on their own labour - as the single most telling sign of quality. The investigation found that this warranty can range from a minimal two years to an exceptional 25 years, or even a "lifetime" bundled warranty from an institution like Penfolds Roofing & Solar.

"That 25-year workmanship warranty from Shift is almost unheard-of," Lano expressed. "It includes a production guarantee, meaning they stand behind their performance promises. On the other end, Penfolds, a company operating since 1937, offers a 'Peace of Mind' warranty that bundles the roof and solar together. This completely eliminates the nightmare scenario of a roofer and a solar installer blaming each other for a leak."

With the 0% federal loan gone, the report details the new financing reality. The market has split into two main paths: in-house 0% financing, often offered by high-volume national installers, or a "rebate stacking" model favored by technical, long-standing local installers.

"There's no free money, and that's okay, as long as homeowners understand the math," Lano suggested. "Our analysis shows how 0% financing from a company like Polaron, which has over 13,200 installs, works. It's a fantastic tool for managing monthly cash flow, but the cost of that loan is almost always built into the total price. A cash quote will be thousands less."

Lano added, "The other path is just as powerful. A technical installer like Vancouver Renewable Energy (VREC) or Hakai Energy Solutions will guide a homeowner to stack the new \$5,000 BC Hydro solar rebate with the \$5,000 battery rebate, and then use a bank loan from Vancity. This is often a better total value for the homeowner who can pay cash or secure their own financing."

The report from SolarEnergies.ca ultimately concludes that after the market shift, there is no longer a single "best" installer for everyone. The analysis instead categorizes the top companies, allowing homeowners to choose based on their primary goal. The report's findings name Polaron as the "Best for Easiest Financing," Shift Energy as the "Best for Warranty and Service," Penfolds as the "Best for Stability and Roof-Bundling," and identify Hakai, VREC, and Terratek as the "Best for Technical Expertise and Battery Systems."

"My goal with this analysis is to give homeowners the confidence to make this big decision," Lano concluded. "The power is truly in their hands. By asking the right questions - "What is your workmanship warranty?", "What is the cash price versus the 0% financed price?" and "How long have you been in business?" - homeowners can secure a fantastic, reliable investment for their family. Canada is going solar, and it's a very exciting time to be a part of it."
