"Every winter, we respond to numerous emergency calls related to burst pipes that could have been prevented with proper preparation," said Ramona Kline, Director of Operations at RestoPros of Columbus West. "When temperatures drop below freezing, water inside pipes can freeze and expand, creating pressure that causes pipes to crack or burst. The resulting Water Damage Restoration needs can be extensive and

disruptive to families and businesses."

The company's winter preparation guidelines focus on several critical areas of pipe protection. Property owners should insulate pipes in unheated areas such as basements, crawl spaces, garages, and attics. Exterior faucets require special attention, including disconnecting garden hoses and installing faucet covers. During extreme cold snaps, allowing faucets to drip slightly can prevent water from freezing inside pipes.

Maintaining consistent indoor temperatures proves essential for pipe protection. The restoration experts recommend keeping thermostats set to at least 55 degrees Fahrenheit, even when properties are vacant. Opening cabinet doors under sinks allows warm air to circulate around plumbing, particularly for pipes located against exterior walls.

For property owners who travel during winter months, additional precautions become necessary. Shutting off the main water supply and draining the system can eliminate the risk of pipe bursts during extended absences. Having a trusted neighbor or property manager check the property regularly provides an extra layer of protection.

"Prevention costs far less than restoration," Kline noted. "Taking these steps now can prevent the stress and expense of dealing with water damage during what should be a peaceful winter season."

The restoration company also advises property owners to know the location of their main water shut-off valve and ensure all household members understand how to use it. Quick action during a pipe burst can significantly reduce the extent of water damage.
