



# **Atlanta Metro Law Releases Analysis of Georgia Highway Safety Data Showing 25 Percent of Fatal Crashes Involve Impaired Drivers**

Atlanta Metro Law has released an analysis of Georgia highway safety data revealing that 25 percent of fatal traffic accidents in metro Atlanta involve alcohol-impaired drivers, with Fulton, DeKalb, and Gwinnett counties accounting for 21 percent of all alcohol-related crashes statewide.

The analysis examined recent Georgia Department of Transportation and Governor's Office of Highway Safety data, which documented 507 fatalities across Georgia linked to alcohol-impaired driving in the most recent reporting period. Approximately 20 percent of all fatal crashes in the state involved drivers exceeding the 0.08 percent blood alcohol content legal limit.

Fulton County recorded nearly 2,000 DUI convictions and license suspensions in 2024, according to state judicial records. The data shows that 117 of Georgia's 159 counties experienced at least one alcohol-impaired fatal crash in 2023, demonstrating the statewide nature of the issue.

"The data reveals a persistent public safety challenge that affects families across metro Atlanta," said a representative from Atlanta Metro Law. "Understanding the legal framework surrounding these incidents helps accident victims navigate the complex intersection of criminal proceedings and civil claims that typically follow alcohol-related crashes."

Georgia Department of Public Safety officials attribute high incident rates to concentrated nightlife districts and heavy traffic corridors, particularly along Interstate 285. The combination of entertainment venues and major thoroughfares creates conditions where impaired driving incidents occur with greater frequency.

The analysis highlights specific legal considerations in drunk driving accident cases. Georgia law permits punitive damages against impaired drivers in addition to compensatory damages, creating a distinct legal landscape compared to standard vehicle accident claims. Criminal proceedings against impaired drivers often run parallel to civil litigation, requiring coordination between different legal processes.

Insurance claim procedures in alcohol-related accidents differ from standard collision cases. Documentation requirements include police reports with BAC readings, criminal case information, and evidence of impairment. These cases often involve multiple insurance policies and enhanced liability considerations that extend beyond typical accident claims.

The data analysis examined patterns across metro Atlanta's major counties. DeKalb County showed concentrated incidents near entertainment districts, while Gwinnett County data indicated higher rates along major highway interchanges. These geographic patterns inform both enforcement priorities and legal case preparation requirements.

State highway safety initiatives have increased enforcement and education efforts, yet the data shows minimal year-over-year reduction in alcohol-related fatalities. This persistence suggests that legal preparedness and understanding of rights remain important considerations for metro Atlanta residents.
