The emphasis on routine organization allows staff to prepare materials and spaces for group participation without disrupting established patterns.

Meagan Foster, Regional Director at Magic Memories, notes the operational aspect of this planning. ?The calendar provides clear reference points that help our teachers organize group activities efficiently,? said Foster. ?It allows us to prepare for participation in a structured way that fits into our daily routines.?

Staff at the Jeffersonville center follow a consistent process for integrating these observances. Teachers review the calendar periodically to identify relevant dates and determine suitable group formats. Art-based activities often serve as the chosen method for these moments, with children engaging in collaborative projects that correspond to the observance. For instance, a recent classroom activity involved a group art project connected to a nationally recognized date, where children participated together in creating a shared piece as part of their routine schedule.

This practice reflects the broader approach at Magic Memories Jeffersonville, where classroom planning prioritizes structure and predictability. Teachers prepare group activities in alignment with the calendar, ensuring that participation occurs within established routines. The use of art-based formats supports collective involvement during these planned moments, contributing to the overall organization of the day.

Meagon Foster highlights the role of advance preparation in maintaining these routines. ?Planning ahead based on the calendar ensures that group activities run smoothly and integrate seamlessly into our classroom schedule,? she said.

The Jeffersonville location serves children across various age groups, from infants through pre-kindergarten, with before- and after-school care also available. Classrooms are organized by age to facilitate small-group interactions, and staff coordinate daily activities to support consistent routines. The incorporation of calendar-based observances adds a layer of organization to these efforts, helping teachers align group participation with external dates.
