



KWENCH Coworking & Culture Club Announces Enhancements to Core Services in Victoria

KWENCH Coworking & Culture Club has announced a series of improvements to its primary services at its Store Street location in Victoria, British Columbia. The updates reflect an operational shift informed by member feedback, evolving work patterns, and the organization's ongoing focus on integrating professional workspace with cultural and community programming. The changes are now in effect at the club's downtown Victoria location.

Founded in Victoria and operated from a restored heritage building at 2031 Store Street, KWENCH Coworking & Culture Club functions as a combined workspace and cultural hub serving freelancers, remote professionals, entrepreneurs, and teams from across Greater Victoria. The organization confirmed that recent enhancements focus on Hotdesking, resident desks, private offices, and meeting and boardroom services, with adjustments intended to improve daily usability, comfort, and access.

According to the organization, the updates were developed over several months and guided by usage data,

direct member input, and broader trends affecting how people use shared work environments. While KWENCH has maintained a single physical location, its services are utilized by members commuting from surrounding communities, including Saanich, Oak Bay, Langford, and Esquimalt, many of whom prefer flexible access over traditional office leases.

Hotdesking services have been adjusted to improve availability and circulation throughout the space. Changes include refinements to desk layouts, improved power access, and upgraded internet capacity to support sustained use throughout the day. The organization noted that these changes were designed to support both short-term users and members who rely on Hotdesking as a primary work arrangement.

Resident desk memberships were also updated to provide greater consistency for individuals seeking a regular workstation. Improvements include enhanced storage options, refined desk placement to balance privacy with shared space interaction, and expanded access hours. These updates aim to support members whose work requires stability without committing to long-term commercial leases.

Private offices received modifications focused on sound management, lighting, and adaptability for teams. KWENCH stated that the updated offices are intended to better accommodate hybrid work patterns, allowing teams to use the space for collaborative sessions while maintaining access to shared amenities throughout the building. The offices continue to operate on flexible membership terms rather than fixed multi-year agreements.

Meeting rooms and boardrooms were updated to reflect increased demand for in-person collaboration. Enhancements include upgraded audiovisual equipment, improved booking systems, and adjustments to room layouts to support workshops, presentations, and team meetings. These services are used by members as well as external organizations hosting sessions in downtown Victoria.

In addition to workspace-related updates, the organization confirmed that shared amenities have been refined to better align with daily member use. Access to communal areas, wellness facilities, and event spaces has been adjusted to minimize scheduling conflicts and enhance the flow throughout the building. While the club continues to host cultural programming and community events, the recent changes emphasize operational improvements rather than expanded offerings.

Tessa McLoughlin, founder and owner of KWENCH Coworking & Culture Club, said the enhancements reflect how members are actually using the space. "The goal was to refine what already exists rather than add complexity," Tessa McLoughlin said. "Members rely on KWENCH for focused work, connection, and access to shared resources. These updates are about making each of those elements function more smoothly daily."

KWENCH indicated that the improvements also respond to broader shifts in professional life, including increased remote work, shorter planning cycles, and demand for adaptable environments. Rather than positioning services around square footage alone, the organization continues to emphasize flexibility, hospitality, and cultural engagement as part of its operating model.

The Store Street location remains the organization's sole physical site, though services are used by professionals from across the region. KWENCH stated that refining service quality at the Victoria location remains a priority before any future expansion is considered.

Since opening, KWENCH Coworking & Culture Club has become known locally for blending workspace with wellness, arts, and events under one roof. The organization reports serving hundreds of members annually, ranging from independent professionals to businesses and project-based teams. Its location in the Arts & Innovation district has also been associated with broader efforts to activate underused urban spaces through adaptive reuse.

The organization emphasized that the recent service enhancements are operational rather than promotional in nature. No changes to ownership, location, or core mission were announced as part of the update. Instead, the focus remains on maintaining a functional, well-managed environment that supports professional work while remaining connected to the surrounding community.


