



All-On-4 Dental Implants Wilmslow Cheshire Private Dentist Dr Nikhil Oberai Recommends Missing Teeth Consultations at The Croft Dental & Implant Practice

The update reflects continued demand for structured approaches to restoring multiple missing teeth, with Dr Nikhil Oberai advising that an early consultation allows a clearer understanding of suitable treatment pathways.

All-On-4 dental implants are commonly used in cases where an entire upper or lower arch of teeth requires replacement. The treatment involves placing four implants into the jawbone, which act as a stable base for a fixed set of replacement teeth. These implants are positioned carefully to support the arch and provide stability during everyday activities such as eating and speaking.

According to The Croft Dental & Implant Practice, this method focuses on using a small number of

implants to support a complete set of teeth, rather than placing individual implants for each missing tooth. The dental team noted that this approach may be considered where several teeth have been lost or where traditional dentures are no longer suitable. Careful planning is required, taking into account bone structure, gum health, and general oral condition before any decision is made.

Consultations for All-On-4 dental implants at The Croft Dental & Implant Practice begin with a discussion about the patient's dental history and the current condition of the mouth. The dental team will assess the number of missing teeth, the health of the gums, and the level of bone available to support implants. Imaging or digital scans may be used to provide additional detail, helping to form a clear picture of the existing structure.

Evidence from long-term research has enabled more informed understanding of implant outcomes. A 2024 study titled "How far can we go? A 20-year meta-analysis of dental implant survival rates", published in Clinical Oral Investigations and coordinated in Mainz, Germany, reported that around four out of five dental implants remain successful over time. Conducted by Kupka JR, König J, Al-Nawas B, Sagheb K, and Schiegnitz E, the research highlighted that implant loss can occur for several reasons, emphasising the importance of ongoing follow-up care and careful long-term monitoring. The study also noted that maintaining consistent standards in treatment planning and aftercare plays a role in achieving stable long-term outcomes.

Dr Nikhil Oberai noted that suitability for full-arch implant treatment varies between individuals. Some patients may be suitable for All-On-4 dental implants, while others may be advised to consider alternative approaches depending on clinical findings. The consultation stage allows time to explain the steps involved, discuss potential timelines, and address any questions about the procedure.

Alongside full-arch solutions, The Croft Dental & Implant Practice provides a range of dental implant treatments designed to replace single teeth or multiple teeth in different areas of the mouth. These treatments follow similar principles but are adapted to suit varying levels of tooth loss.

Single tooth implants are often used where a single gap has developed, supporting a replacement crown that functions in a similar way to a natural tooth. Multiple implants may be considered where several neighbouring teeth are missing, allowing a bridge or group of teeth to be supported by a limited number of implants. Each approach is planned individually, based on the condition of the surrounding teeth and overall oral health.

The Croft Dental & Implant Practice has indicated that consultations are structured to provide clear and balanced information before any treatment decisions are made. This includes outlining the stages of implant placement, discussing healing periods, and explaining how follow-up care is arranged. Patients are given time to consider the information and ask questions about their individual circumstances.
