

U.S. Wound Explores the Growing Role of Mobile Wound Care Services in Austin

Across the Austin area, aging populations and Medicare Part B beneficiaries are driving strong demand for home-based support. Many residents over 65 face mobility limitations, transportation challenges, or caregiving responsibilities that make frequent clinic visits difficult. This approach helps older adults and loved ones maintain consistent care plans without navigating busy waiting rooms or long travel times across congested corridors of the metro.
