



## **Wexford Jewelers Releases Behind the Bench Feature on Workshop Operations**

Wexford Jewelers has published a new blog post titled Behind the Bench, which provides a detailed look at the daily activities in its workshop. The post, dated March 5, 2026, describes the processes involved in jewelry repairs, restorations, custom designs, and production. This feature highlights the team of bench jewelers who manage these operations on a regular basis.

The workshop, known internally as the shop, serves as the location where rings are polished, resized while customers wait, and inspected for free. Gemstones are set in various pieces, and heirlooms receive restoration work. Additional tasks include engraving photographs onto keepsake tags, creating new rings from old stones, and transforming rings into memorial pendants. The post outlines steps such as casting, molding, injecting wax, pre-finishing castings, laser engraving, finishing, rhodium plating, and advanced diamond setting. These activities occur daily as part of the store's standard procedures.

The team consists of several members with specialized roles. Emily Nichols, Co-Owner and master bench jeweler, oversees shop operations and performs delicate gemstone settings as well as complex repairs. She grew up in the business under the guidance of founder Angelo Roncari. Jason Nichols handles casting,

molding, injecting, pre-finishing, and laser engraving. Eugene, a bench jeweler since 2011, manages repairs, restorations, sizing, re-tipping, and gemstone setting after graduating from the Texas Institute of Jewelry Technology. Alex, also known as Ginger, focuses on finishing, gemstone setting, and rhodium plating for both in-house collections and client projects following attendance at Drouhard National Jewelry School.

The post emphasizes the collaborative nature of the work, where every resized ring, set stone, and restored heirloom passes through the hands of this group. Examples of completed projects include refurbishing great-grandmother's wedding rings, sizing rings on the same day, and crafting mother's rings to mark family events. Custom work incorporates rare specialty cut diamonds or gemstones into one-of-a-kind pieces, such as a 14K rose gold multi-gemstone ring featuring garnet, peridot, opal, and aquamarine. Other items mentioned are a 14K yellow gold rubellite garnet diamond pendant and a multi-gemstone mosaic necklace.

Repair services address a range of needs, from basic cleaning and inspection to full restorations. The post notes instances of converting loved ones' rings into heart-shaped memorial pendants. Custom design services allow for the creation of new items based on client specifications, including the use of existing stones in updated settings. These capabilities support various client requests without frequent use of negative responses.

Gift cards and the WJ Insider program provide additional avenues for engagement with services. The post connects these workshop activities to the broader selection of fine jewelry available in the showroom.

Emily Nichols, Co-Owner of Wexford Jewelers, commented on the team's approach. "The workshop handles repairs, restorations, and custom designs through daily collaboration among the bench jewelers," Nichols said.

Julie Terwilliger, Co-Owner, added context about operations. "The processes described reflect the consistent application of skills developed over years in the trade," Terwilliger said.

The blog post forms part of a series that explores aspects of the jewelry business. It is accessible through the store's online resources. This release occurs as the business continues its established practices in the field.
