



## Graduation Ceremonies Adopt Red Carpet Runner Walkways to Define Recognition Moments and Photo Environments

Even subtle variations in surface—such as a raised or cushioned runner—can introduce a slight physical lift, creating a distinction between the general floor and the ceremonial route. This transition reinforces the moment of recognition as graduates approach the stage, marking a shift from participant to honoree.

“Graduation is one of the few events where every individual is acknowledged in sequence,” said Edward A. Baker, founder of RedCarpetRunner.com, also known as “The Red Carpet Guy.” “The pathway to the stage becomes a defined moment—both in how it’s experienced and how it’s recorded.”

In addition to aisle runners, designated flooring elements such as logo-printed rugs are being placed at key points of pause, including stage fronts and photography areas. These placements allow institutions to incorporate school identity into the visual record while maintaining consistency across hundreds or thousands of individual moments.

The growing emphasis on documentation—particularly for digital sharing—has contributed to demand for controlled visual environments. Defined walkways and staging areas help ensure that lighting, framing, and background elements remain consistent throughout the ceremony, regardless of venue size or layout.
