Learning Tree Academy participated in Autism Awareness Week through a series of activities at its early childhood education facilities. Students and staff wore blue clothing as part of the observance, created themed crafts, and organized a bake sale to support Autism of NJ. These efforts took place at the academy's centers and reflected its ongoing engagement with community initiatives focused on awareness and inclusion.

The activities aligned with the academy's approach to early childhood development. Children in the infant, toddler, and preschool programs took part in the crafts projects, which encouraged creativity while introducing concepts of support and understanding. Staff members joined the children in wearing blue to promote visibility for the cause. The bake sale involved contributions from families and served as a collaborative event that brought together the school community.

Nataliya Malinovsky, Owner of Learning Tree Academy, said, "Activities during Autism Awareness Week

provide opportunities for our young learners to engage with themes of acceptance in an age-appropriate manner that supports their social and emotional growth."

The academy offers early childhood care and education programs designed for children from six weeks to five years of age. Its infant program serves children six weeks to 18 months old and focuses on creating a nurturing setting where the youngest learners can explore safely. Toddler programs for ages 18 months to three years emphasize building foundational social skills through guided play and daily routines. Preschool programs for children ages 3 to 5 prepare students for future academic experiences by fostering confidence and a love of learning at an individual pace.

A summer camp program extends services to children from preschool through first grade. This option provides continued educational opportunities during school breaks and builds upon skills developed during the regular year. The academy also supplies before and after-school care for students enrolled in universal prekindergarten at Carlstadt public schools. Such partnerships help ensure continuity in learning environments for eligible families.

The academy serves families across Bergen, Hudson, and Passaic Counties in New Jersey. Its programs operate from two sites, one in Wood Ridge and one in Succasunna, and focus on delivering consistent care and education in a home-away-from-home atmosphere. This philosophy prioritizes safety and nurturing while allowing children to grow through exploration and interaction.

Malinovsky added, "Community-focused events such as the bake sale help connect our families with organizations like Autism of NJ and reinforce the values of empathy and collaboration that we emphasize daily."

By integrating Autism Awareness Week activities into its regular schedule, the academy demonstrated how educational settings can contribute to broader societal awareness. The crafts and clothing choices served as visual and hands-on reminders of the importance of acceptance. The bake sale proceeds directed toward Autism of NJ illustrated practical ways for early childhood programs to support relevant causes without disrupting daily learning routines.

The participation also highlighted the role of experienced educators in facilitating these moments. Teachers incorporated the activities into existing play-based structures, ensuring that children experienced them as natural extensions of their curriculum rather than separate events. This method supports the academy's goal of fostering inclusive mindsets from the earliest stages of development.

Programs at Learning Tree Academy remain flexible to accommodate family needs. Preschool enrollment often aligns with the academic calendar, starting in August or September, with some midyear options

available in December or January. Summer camp registration typically opens in February. Such scheduling allows families to plan around school and work commitments while maintaining access to high-quality care.

The academy's emphasis on social skills development complements awareness initiatives. Daily interactions in group settings teach children how to navigate relationships and recognize diverse perspectives. Participation in events like Autism Awareness Week extends these lessons into real-world applications and strengthens the connection between classroom learning and community values.
