These everyday classroom interactions build physical coordination as children navigate structured routines that combine rhythm and motion. "Movement-based learning plays a vital role in helping children develop physical coordination and the ability to participate effectively in group settings," said Ashley Edmunds, Director at the Jeffersonville location of Magic Memories.

The physical benefits of such activities extend to improved body awareness and motor skill development, which support children as they grow and explore their surroundings. At Jeffersonville, the incorporation of enrichments such as yoga and physical education provides additional opportunities for children to practice balance, flexibility, and teamwork in supportive group formats. These elements complement the center's focus on creating safe spaces where physical activity occurs alongside cognitive and social learning.

Cognitively, movement-based learning contributes to memory skills and attention span by requiring children to remember sequences and focus during guided sessions. The approach aligns with the center's use of personalized lessons through the Learning Beyond Paper curriculum, which tailors activities to each child's developmental stage.

Behaviorally, participation in group movement experiences fosters self-regulation and cooperation. Children learn to follow structured instructions, which promotes positive classroom dynamics and helps build confidence in social interactions. The Jeffersonville location's emphasis on transparent relationships between teachers and families reinforces these outcomes, as daily communication highlights progress in behavioral areas tied to active learning.

Additional perspective from the leadership team underscores the observed trends. "In our experience at Jeffersonville, these activities contribute to improved attention and memory skills as children follow structured instructions through movement," said Katina Rollins, Assistant Director at the Jeffersonville location of Magic Memories.

Magic Memories further connects movement-based learning with its STEAM-focused elements, where physical exploration intersects with science, technology, engineering, arts, and math concepts. Children at Jeffersonville apply movement in creative ways during experiments and hands-on activities, strengthening both analytical thinking and physical engagement.
