Symptoms may involve aching or stiffness that worsens with prolonged positions, sharp pain radiating to shoulders or arms, reduced range of motion, headaches originating at the skull base, and tingling or numbness in the arms and hands.

Back pain arises from the spine's central role in movement and support. Frequent causes encompass muscle or ligament strains from lifting or sudden actions, poor posture leading to imbalances, herniated discs pressing on nerves, sciatica involving radiating leg pain, and degenerative changes affecting cartilage between vertebrae. Associated symptoms include constant throbbing discomfort, sudden intense pain, stiffness limiting bending or twisting, radiating pain into the buttocks or legs, and muscle cramping.

Active Chiropractic delivers neck and back pain treatment in Raleigh through evidence-informed methods that target root causes. Chiropractic adjustments employ diversified, drop table, and flexion-distraction techniques to realign the spine, reduce nerve pressure, alleviate stiffness, and enhance mobility. These interventions pair with massage therapy to ease muscle tension and improve circulation. Softwave therapy utilizes acoustic waves to promote tissue repair and decrease inflammation. Dry needling addresses trigger points for tension relief, while postural training strengthens supporting muscles and corrects alignment. Acupuncture and nutritional guidance further support recovery by aiding circulation, balance, and inflammation management.

Dr. Molly Hall, chiropractor and owner of Active Chiropractic, outlined the practice's methodology. "Our synergistic approach combines adjustments with soft tissue therapies and rehabilitative exercises to help patients regain mobility and reduce pain from neck and back conditions," said Dr. Hall. "This integration addresses joint, nerve, muscle, and ligament health for more complete outcomes."

Dr. Matthew Murphy, chiropractor at Active Chiropractic, added details on treatment application. Red light therapy, under holistic health coach Lindsay Gilbert, supports inflammation reduction. Lifestyle education covers ergonomics, exercise, and nutrition to prevent recurrence.
