

Born to Move Movers Announces Expanded Local Relocation Services Across Greater Boston Communities

The expanded service availability focuses on relocations within approximately 50 miles, a category commonly defined in the moving industry as a local move. Local moving services include both residential relocations and commercial moves, allowing households, offices, and small businesses to relocate within the same metropolitan area or between neighboring municipalities.

In densely populated regions such as Greater Boston, local relocations frequently involve apartment buildings, offices, retail spaces, and residential neighborhoods where logistics may include narrow streets, building access rules, freight elevator scheduling, and limited parking availability.

According to the company, the expanded coverage reflects the ongoing movement of both residents and businesses between communities throughout the metropolitan area. Cities including Newton, Cambridge, and Boston experience consistent relocation activity due to the presence of universities, healthcare institutions, research facilities, and technology companies operating across the region.

Born to Move Movers operates a fleet of straight trucks equipped with ramps, lift gates, dollies, moving straps, and protective furniture blankets designed to safeguard furniture, office equipment, and boxed items during transportation. Each relocation follows a structured workflow that includes preparing a moving estimate, an inventory list documenting transported items, and a bill of lading that serves as the official contract between the carrier and the customer.

In the moving industry, documentation is essential for organizing relocation logistics. A bill of lading establishes shipment details, including pickup and delivery locations, transportation terms, and valuation coverage options. Inventory lists record transported items, while estimates outline pricing structures based on hourly labor or flat-rate pricing, depending on the scale and complexity of the relocation.

The company reports that its operations rely on trained in-house crews rather than subcontracted labor. Typical local moves involve coordinated teams consisting of a driver responsible for truck operation, packers who prepare items using moving boxes and protective materials, and supervisors who oversee loading, transport, and unloading procedures.

Local relocation work requires careful planning and reliable communication, said Dmitrii Malashkin, owner of Born to Move Movers. Moves within Boston and surrounding communities often involve building access requirements, parking permits, or tight urban environments. Organized procedures help ensure that every stage of the move is completed safely and efficiently.

In urban areas such as Boston and Cambridge, relocation planning frequently includes coordination with building management offices and municipal parking regulations. Some streets require temporary parking permits for moving trucks, while commercial buildings may require certificates of insurance or scheduled freight elevator access prior to moving day.

As part of the expanded service availability, Born to Move Movers indicated that relocation planning may include coordination with property management teams, building supervisors, and municipal permit offices, as needed, to facilitate smooth move-day logistics.

Industry research indicates that short-distance relocations represent the majority of moves within the United States. These moves often occur due to employment changes, office expansions, housing transitions, or new business locations. Within the Greater Boston area, universities, medical centers, and technology employers contribute to ongoing relocation activity among both residents and businesses.

Newton, where Born to Move Movers maintains its primary office, is part of the Boston metropolitan area and is connected by major transportation routes, including Interstate 90 and Route 9. The city is also served by

the MBTA Green Line and commuter rail stations such as Newtonville, West Newton, and Auburndale, which connect residents and businesses to employment centers throughout the region.
