



KEGE Center for ADHD Reviews Scheduling Capacity to Support Consistent Patient Care

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KEGE Center for ADHD announced the completion of an internal review of its clinical and administrative processes to support consistency in ADHD evaluation and ongoing care. The psychiatric practice stated that the review focused on aligning documentation, scheduling workflows, and follow-up practices across providers serving patients in the Gilbert office and through secure online visits available throughout Arizona.

According to the organization, the internal review was conducted as part of routine quality oversight to ensure that established care standards are applied consistently as patient volume and care delivery formats evolve. KEGE Center for ADHD noted that maintaining predictable clinical processes is an important component of providing structured ADHD care over time.

The review included an assessment of evaluation documentation practices used by board-certified providers during initial assessments and follow-up visits. Providers examined how clinical findings, screening results, and care recommendations are recorded to support continuity across appointments. The practice stated that standardized documentation helps ensure that prior evaluations and treatment decisions can be referenced accurately as care progresses.

When clinically appropriate, ADHD evaluations include screening for co-occurring conditions such as anxiety, mood concerns, insomnia, oppositional defiant disorder, and depression. The organization reported that documentation related to screening results and clinical considerations was part of the internal review to confirm that information is clearly recorded and accessible during follow-up care.

Following evaluation, KEGE Center for ADHD provides medication management when indicated, with follow-up visits used to monitor response and adjust care plans as needed. The internal review also examined how follow-up recommendations and medication monitoring notes are documented to support consistent clinical decision-making over time. The practice emphasized that this review did not change service offerings but focused on process alignment.

For pediatric patients ages six to twelve, KEGE Center for ADHD may use KEGE Bridge as part of the evaluation process when appropriate. KEGE Bridge is a secure system for gathering teacher or caregiver feedback to strengthen diagnostic accuracy. The organization stated that documentation related to caregiver and educator input was included in the review to support clarity across pediatric evaluations.

The practice also reviewed administrative workflows related to appointment scheduling and follow-up coordination. KEGE Center for ADHD noted that clear internal processes help ensure that patients receive consistent information about appointment timing, follow-up expectations, and care coordination regardless of visit format.

KEGE Center for ADHD continues to use KEGE Connect, a patient portal that supports scheduling, secure communication, and medication refill coordination. The internal review included confirmation that portal-based communication aligns with documentation and follow-up practices used by providers, supporting continuity across care encounters.

As part of the review, providers also evaluated how evaluation summaries are communicated to patients during follow-up visits. The practice stated that clear, structured explanations of findings help patients better understand their diagnosis and the rationale behind care recommendations.

The organization noted that internal alignment across providers supports continuity when patients transition between in-office and online appointments. By maintaining consistent processes across visit formats, the practice aims to reduce variation in care delivery and documentation.

KEGE Center for ADHD reported that the review also considered how administrative staff and providers coordinate information sharing. Clear internal communication processes help ensure that scheduling, documentation, and follow-up actions remain aligned throughout the care process.

The practice stated that ongoing internal reviews help identify opportunities to reinforce consistency without increasing administrative burden for patients. Adjustments are made carefully to preserve clarity while maintaining efficiency in clinical workflows.

KEGE Center for ADHD added that feedback from providers is incorporated into periodic process reviews. This approach allows the practice to refine internal standards while maintaining a unified clinical framework focused on ADHD care.

The organization also noted that maintaining consistent internal processes supports continuity for patients who receive care over longer periods. By reinforcing standardized practices, providers are able to reference prior evaluations and treatment decisions more effectively as care progresses.

"Consistency across evaluations and follow-up visits is essential for ADHD care," said Keith Getic, founder of KEGE Center for ADHD. "This review helps ensure that patients receive care within a clear and predictable clinical framework, even as care needs evolve."

The organization stated that internal reviews of clinical and administrative processes are conducted periodically to support alignment with established care standards. Findings from the review did not result in changes to provider roles, service scope, or geographic availability.

KEGE Center for ADHD emphasized that its services remain focused exclusively on ADHD evaluation and management. The practice does not provide therapy directly and continues to coordinate care through referrals when additional counseling is recommended. All services are available only to Arizona residents, either through the Gilbert office or online throughout the state.

The practice stated that it will continue routine review of internal processes to support clarity, consistency, and continuity of ADHD care across Arizona.
