Microneedling has been used in medical and aesthetic settings for a range of skin concerns and is typically performed in a controlled clinical environment. Oghosa Ogiemwonyi, Owner of SKIN Clinics, indicated that the expansion aligns with the clinic's approach to offering medically guided aesthetic procedures. SKIN Clinics noted that while microneedling is generally associated with minimal downtime, post-treatment responses can vary. As part of standard care, patients receive guidance on post-procedure skin care and are advised on follow-up timelines if additional sessions are recommended. The clinic stated that patient education is considered a central component of treatment delivery.

The availability of microneedling services across additional Calgary neighbourhoods is part of SKIN Clinics' broader service development strategy. The clinic offers a range of dermatology, skincare, laser, and medical aesthetic treatments and reports that service expansions are evaluated based on clinical relevance,

practitioner readiness, and patient interest.

The clinic stated that the expanded access to microneedling does not represent a change in clinical philosophy but rather an extension of services already integrated into its practice.

The clinic stated that future service developments will remain guided by clinical standards, professional training, and patient education.
