permanent steel chassis. Modular homes are factory-built in sections to state and local building codes, similar to traditional site-built homes, and are placed on a foundation. Both are factory-built, but building code, financing path, foundation planning, customization, placement, and long-term use can differ.

That distinction matters when buyers compare floor plans and decide which home type fits their land, budget, financing needs, and long-term plans. Mobile homes may offer a simpler model-selection process and a lower starting price in many cases. Modular homes may allow broader structural customization depending on the plan, manufacturer, budget, and local building requirements. The stronger option depends on the buyer's property, service area, project scope, timeline, and desired level of design flexibility.

Service path is another major part of the resource. Home-Only service means Next Modular delivers and sets the completed home, while the buyer handles site work, foundation, permits, utilities, and related coordination. Single-wide and double-wide mobile homes can also serve different needs. A single-wide may work for buyers who want a smaller footprint or lower starting price. A double-wide may provide wider rooms, more living space, and stronger separation between shared and private areas. The better choice depends on the buyer's land, budget, household size, delivery needs, and layout priorities.

The resource also addresses new versus used mobile homes. A used mobile home may have a lower upfront

purchase price, but age, condition, repairs, transport limits, setup costs, financing questions, and hidden maintenance can affect the total cost. A new mobile home gives buyers a clearer path around model selection, available options, delivery, setup, and project planning, though final pricing still depends on the full scope of the project.

Financing can also vary by home type, land status, foundation, lender requirements, and project structure.
